PREFACE

This handbook has been developed to help the students of Beatrice High School in their securing monies for higher education. This is a service we are pleased to offer our district patrons. As you will see, this manual contains a wealth of information. Much of it is available through other sources; however, we have attempted to condense and focus this information to meet the needs of our students. We hope that you find the handbook informative and helpful.

We encourage all students who plan to attend a post secondary institution to read this handbook and apply for any scholarships for which they may be eligible. Please remember that financial aid is precisely what it means, **AID**. It is not intended to replace family and student contributions. Some students will be eligible for more aid than others and some will qualify because of their talents, effort, and abilities for scholarships and grants. The simple fact is, however, if you don't apply, you are guaranteed not to receive. So take your time, do a good job of filling out the applications neatly and accurately, and be sure to meet the application deadlines. We wish you well on your search for financial assistance to help pay for further education. If we can be of any help, please do not hesitate to call us in the Student Services Office.

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A copy of this booklet will be given to each BHS senior before Christmas break. Replacement copies and non BHS students/parents who request the booklet will be charged \$5.00 to cover printing costs.

Paying for college can generate a lot of stress and worry for parents, especially when they take a look at the price tags of schools. As a result, some families do not encourage their children to go to college because they do not believe they can afford it. They also don't consider the more expensive schools because the high cost of tuition scares them off. Other families forego applying for financial aid because they think their family income is too high or that they have too much in savings. However, thanks to financial aid, not only is college affordable for all families, but most families qualify for enough aid to make even the most expensive school affordable.

Talk with your child about your ability and willingness to pay for college. Keep the lines of communication open about finances. Be clear and realistic about your financial limitations as well as your expectations of the role your child will take in the process of applying to and financing college.

Financial Aid: Facts

Everyone should apply for financial aid- There are so many different factors that determine aid eligibility that no one can give you a simple answer as to whether or not you are eligible for aid. Family income and assets are not the only aspects that determine eligibility for need-based aid; family size and number of children in college are almost as important.

Parents should make sure students are involved in and understand the financial aid process- At most colleges, the student is the first point of contact for administrative issues. Many times, the financial aid process is the first step that students take in learning to manage their own financial matters.

Make sure that learning more about financial aid is on your radar screen early- Too often families put nearly all their effort into the admission process and treat financial aid as an afterthought. This is a mistake. Learn as much as you can about the aid policies and practices at the colleges your child is considering.

Just so I understand, financial aid is... money that is supplied by outside sources to help pay for the cost of an education beyond high school. It is important to note that there are two basic categories of financial aid: need-based and non-need based.

Non-need based aid- is also known as merit based aid. It is generally given to students in recognition of special skills, talent, or academic ability.

Need based aid- when a family does not have sufficient resources to pay for an education beyond high school, they are considered to have financial need.

Paying for college- applying for financial aid is not difficult if you are prepared.

Follow these steps to determine how you will pay for college.

STEP #1--Learn what types of financial aid are available:

- **Scholarships-** come from private donors or from your college and are not repaid. Some are based on financial need while others are based on criteria such as academics, leadership, athletics, talent, or other criteria.
- **Grants-** are based on financial need and you don't repay them. They include:
 - Pell Grant
 - Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant
 - State Grants
 - College-based grants and tuition assistance programs
- **Work Study-** based on financial need, allows you to work and earn money while attending college.
- **Loans-** are a type of financial aid you must repay with interest. Some are in the student name and others are for the parent.

STEP #2--Applying for scholarships

- Look for scholarships during your junior or senior year.
 - i. Ask your school counselor about local scholarships
 - ii. Apply for college based awards
 - iii. Look for national awards using internet scholarship searches.
- If an essay is required, follow the instructions carefully. Be clear, concise and understandable, and ask someone else to review it.
- Complete a resume to keep a record of your extracurricular activities.
- If needed, request letters of recommendations from teachers, school counselors, coaches, and other adults who know you well. Give them plenty of notice, a deadline, and a copy of your resume.
- Focus mainly on college specific and local awards. You will have a better chance of earning local awards over national scholarships.

STEP #3--Request a Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID)

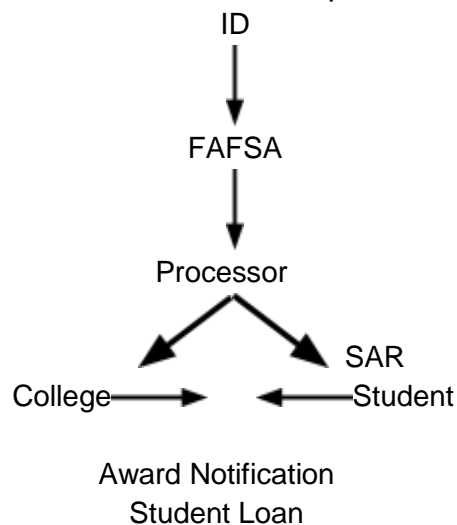
The ID is your signature for the electronic FAFSA. Request an ID for you and one for a parent at fsaid.ed.gov. Keep your ID for future years.

STEP #4--Complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid).

The FAFSA is your application for federal, state and college-based financial aid. Complete the FAFSA at fafsa.gov. The colleges you list on the application will receive the results and will use that information to award financial aid.

- Apply after October 1 but before the colleges' priority date
- Complete the FAFSA every year you are in college.

This is how the financial aid process works:



STEP #5--Complete the financial aid process

- Expect a **S**tudent **A**id **R**eport (SAR). The SAR acknowledges that your FAFSA was received and can be used to make corrections to the form. You'll need your ID to make electronic corrections. You might also receive a request from the college for documents to verify your FAFSA information. If so, send the documents to the college financial aid office.
- If you have been accepted for admission, the college(s) will provide a financial aid award notification detailing the assistance they are offering based on your financial need. Respond to all award notifications by the deadlines.
- Compare financial aid awards to determine what you would need to spend out-of-pocket or borrow in student loans at each school to cover the full cost of your education. Once you select a college, notify the other schools of your decision.
- If you need student loans, apply for them through your college. Allow several weeks for processing time.

Major Sources of Aid

Each institution's Director of Financial Aid is the best source of information about the various types of aid that institutions have available. Colleges publish a considerable amount of information about their own financial aid programs. Each aid program has its own guidelines on eligibility and amounts to be awarded, and these guidelines are subject to change. A brief summary of a few of the major programs is given here.

PELL GRANTS: A Federal Pell Grant, unlike a loan, does not have to be repaid. The maximum Pell Grant award is \$6,095. The grant amount will vary depending upon the need of the family as determined by the EFC (Expected Family Contribution). The amount you get, though, will depend not only on your financial need, but also on your costs to attend school, your status as a full-time or part-time student, and your plans to attend school for a full academic year or less.

FEDERAL SUPPLEMENTAL EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY GRANTS (FSEOG) is a federal aid program that provides assistance for students with exceptional need. Just like Pell Grants, the FSEOG does not have to be repaid. The grants range from \$100-\$4000 a year. Grants are available to any student with need who is attending at least half-time and progressing normally toward a degree. They are not restricted to students who are expected to or who actually do maintain a strong academic average. Colleges and universities participating in this program make these awards directly and candidates apply through the financial aid office of the institutions they are planning to attend.

TEACH GRANT PROGRAM provides grants of up to \$4,000 a year to students who are completing or plan to complete course work needed to begin a career in teaching. As a condition for receiving a TEACH Grant, you must sign a TEACH Grant Agreement to Serve in which you agree to (among other requirements) teach:

- In a high-need field
- At an elementary school, secondary school or **educational service agency** that serves students from low-income families
- For at least four complete academic years within eight years after completing (or ceasing enrollment in) the course of study for which you received the grant.

IMPORTANT: If you do not complete your service obligation, all TEACH Grants funds you received will be converted to a Direct Unsubsidized Loan. You must then repay this loan to the U.S. Department of Education, with **interest** charged from the date the TEACH Grant was disbursed (paid to you or on your behalf).

THE FEDERAL WORK-STUDY PROGRAM provides jobs for students with demonstrated financial need. Both part-time and full-time students are eligible to participate in the program. Federal studies show that the average amount earned by students under this program is \$1,350 per year. FWS jobs are available through colleges and nonprofit agencies.

FEDERAL PERKINS LOAN is funded by the federal government but is administered directly by colleges and awarded to students with exceptional need and has an interest rate of 5%. Undergraduates can borrow up to \$5,500 for each year of undergraduate study (the total you can borrow as an undergraduate is \$27,500).

FEDERAL STAFFORD LOANS enable students to borrow as much as \$5,500 for the first undergraduate year, \$6,500 your second year and \$7,500 the next two years. NOTE: Each year, an additional \$2,000 of a Federal Unsubsidized Stafford loan may be available. After you graduate or drop below half-time enrollment, you will have a six-month “grace period” before you begin repayment. During the grace period on a subsidized loan, you don’t have to pay any principal, and you won’t be charged interest. During the grace period on an unsubsidized loan, you don’t have to pay any principal but you will be charged interest.

PLUS LOANS allow parents to borrow to pay education expenses for a dependent, undergraduate student enrolled at least half time in an eligible program at an eligible school. The yearly limit on PLUS loans is equal to the cost of attendance minus any other financial aid. Interest rates are fixed at 7.6% for the Direct PLUS Loans.

FAFSA - It’s time to prepare for the FAFSA ... after October 1, 2019!

Preparation is the key to successfully completing and filing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA is the application for state, federal and college-specific financial aid. Even if you don’t think you’ll qualify for need-based financial aid, you should complete the FAFSA to qualify for low-interest student and parent loans.

Follow these steps to complete the FAFSA

Step 1: Request an ID

Request a Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID) for you and one for a parent at www.fsaaid.ed.gov. The ID is your signature for the electronic FAFSA and is used to track your financial aid application.

Step 2: Gather these student and parent items:

- federal income tax forms from prior calendar year
- W-2 forms from prior calendar year
- Student drivers license number
- Social Security numbers
- Birth dates
- Dates parents were married, separated, divorced or widowed
- Current cash, savings and checking account balances
- Business or investment farm value

- Current investment values (stocks, bonds, mutual funds, CD's) excluding your home and retirement accounts
- child support (paid and/or received) from prior calendar year
- Workers' Compensation from prior calendar year
- Housing/food/living allowances for military and clergy
- Student Alien Registration Number for eligible non-citizens
- Veteran's non-education benefits

Be prepared to answer the following FAFSA question:

Did you or anyone in your household receive any of the following federal benefits?

- Supplemental Security Income
- Food Stamps
- TANF
- Free or Reduced Lunch
- WIC

Step 3: Complete and file the FAFSA

Complete and file the FAFSA at www.fafsa.gov. The colleges you list on the application will receive the results.

If you're filing the FAFSA for the first time and need help completing the form, call the EducationQuest location nearest you to set up an appointment. Call the Lincoln office at 402-475-5222, all services are free.

Managing Student Loan Debt

Graduates from public and private four-year colleges average \$24,000 in student loan debt. Add in rent, a car loan, and credit card payments and you may find that your income will not meet all your expenses. Lower your expenses by borrowing only what you need and by avoiding credit cards.

Follow these tips to avoid unnecessary debt:

- Carefully research your college to make sure it's a good fit. Transferring to a different school can add additional years of college and loan debt.
- Compare the estimated starting salary of your future career to your estimated college debt to ensure you can afford future loan payments.
- Use your student loan money only for tuition, books and room/board.
- Work while you go to college and use that money to pay personal expenses.
- Keep track of your student loan debt throughout college at nslds.ed.gov so you're not surprised when it's time to graduate.

Other College Funding Options

- College Payment Plans- Many schools offer a monthly payment plan. Ask your college about finance charges.
- Home Equity Line of Credit Loan-A line of credit allows you to borrow money as you need it, which fits well with tuition payments. Interest may be tax deductible.
- Alternative Loans- Talk to your college financial aid office about alternative loans. Exhaust all federal financial aid before pursuing these loans to get the lowest interest rate available.
- The Military- all military branches offer education assistance including the Montgomery G.I. Bill, tuition reimbursement and student loan repayment. Talk to a recruiter to get all the details.
- AmeriCorps- AmeriCorps engages people in community service in exchange for a stipend and an educational award to pay college expenses or repay qualified student loans. For more information, visit serve.nebraska.gov or www.americorps.gov.

There are many sources of scholarships, this booklet is one. Another source is the BHS monthly newsletter, The Orange Peel. It lists scholarships received by the Student Services Office each month with a brief description and the application deadline. Another source is ScholarshipQuest from the EducationQuest Foundation. Go to www.educationquest.org for assistance. All information from EducationQuest is free to students, parents, and schools. A major source of scholarship help comes from the colleges themselves. Students should be sure to ask each school if the application for admission also contains the application for scholarships or if a separate form must be used.

Nebraska Tuition Remission Scholarships

Nebraska State College System Advantage Program-NSCA

for Wayne State College, Chadron State College, and Peru State College.

If a student is PELL eligible, the recipient will pay no tuition for 16 credits per semester. This is a scholarship for new, first time freshmen. Students will still need to pay fees and room/board. The PELL grant will be used for tuition and cannot be used for other expenses. Go to www.nscs.edu/nsca-advantage.html for more information.

College Bound Nebraska for the University of Nebraska-Kearney, University of Nebraska-Lincoln, University of Nebraska-Omaha, and the University of Nebraska Medical Center.

If a student is PELL eligible the recipient will pay no tuition for 15 credits per semester for as much as four years. The PELL grant will be used for tuition and cannot be used for other expenses. Go to www.collegeboundnebraska.com

Access College Early (ACE) scholarships provide funds for students who are seniors in high school and are taking a dual credit college course. Apply on line at www.ccpe.state.ne.us/publicdoc/ccpe/ACE/default.asp. Students must apply each semester.

Susan Thompson Buffett Foundation scholarship provides renewable scholarships for tuition and fees **up to** \$4,350 per semester, and a textbook allowance of \$500 per semester for incoming freshmen attending Nebraska public universities, colleges or community colleges. Application and Student Aid Report deadline is February 1. www.buffettscholarships.org

Scholarship Warning!

Students and parents should NEVER pay for scholarship searches or financial aid services. Free sources have access to the same scholarship sites as do the for-profit companies. Contact your school counselor if you have questions.

Scholarship Application Ethics

- Complete the scholarship application yourself. Scholarship committees are not impressed with your mother's application.
- Complete the application with a computer, do not use a pencil or pen and hand write an application. If you need help with this process please ask.
- Keep a current resume handy to give people who write letters of recommendations for you.
- Ask your teachers (or anyone else) to mail letters of recommendation directly whenever possible. The Student Services Office is used as the clearinghouse and letters can be turned in here, but students should not have access to them.
- All letters of recommendation should be originals, do not photocopy them and reuse in another application.
- Though it may be convenient, it is unethical to ask people for generic letters of recommendation that you may use at will.
- Allow people a minimum of two weeks to write a letter of recommendation for you.

Senior Checklist

Below is a checklist for seniors to use as a guideline.

- Student and parent need to apply for FAFSA ID at www.fsaaid.ed.gov.
- Schedule an appointment with EducationQuest in Lincoln if you would like free assistance in completing the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) 402-475-5222.

- **OR** RJ Vega now comes to BHS two times a month. To schedule an appointment date and time, please sign up at: <https://goo.gl/ObAfJs> All meetings take place in the privacy of our Media Center.
- Go to www.fafsa.ed.gov if you plan on completing the FAFSA on your own.
- Contact top college choices now and ask about deadlines and process for applying for admission, college based scholarships and financial aid.
- Apply to your top 3 colleges before the deadline.
- Fill out an official transcript request form in the Student Services Office for each college you are applying to.
- Complete a resume of extracurricular activities.
- Ask what additional items some colleges may require: Essay, interview, letter of recommendation.
- Contact the colleges you have applied to and find out your admission status before winter break.

HOW TO APPLY FOR LOCAL SCHOLARSHIPS ON-LINE

1. Go to the Beatrice Public Schools website: www.beatricepublicschools.org
2. Click the three horizontal bars in the upper left-hand corner to expand the menu
3. Click on Beatrice High School
4. Click on Student Services
5. Click on Scholarship Applications
6. Click on the name of the scholarship you wish to apply for
7. Complete the application on line and print it
8. Submit the printed, signed copy to Mrs. Morris in the BHS Student Services Office
9. Notice there is a copy of the BHS Financial Aid Handbook on line as well
10. Notice there is a transcript request form at the Student Services site on-line if you prefer to use it or you may complete a form with Mrs. Morris when you need to send transcripts to colleges or to scholarship agencies.

Remember: not all applications are on-line. Be sure to request other individual applications from Mrs. Morris in the Student Services Office.

LOCAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Student Services acts as a clearinghouse for applications for many local scholarships. A scholarship committee makes recommendations to some organizations, and makes the final decisions on other local scholarships. Many applications for local scholarships are available in the Student Services Office in December. Awards and scholarships are announced at the Scholastic Achievement Banquet in late Spring. Some organizations publicize the winners earlier. Listed below are local scholarships for which applications are available in the Student Services Office.
